OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT ON DRAFT PROPOSED RULE: DECOMMISSIONING PLANNING (FSME-07-063)

Purpose: To inform you of an opportunity to comment on a draft proposed rule to amend 10 CFR Parts 20, 30, 40, 50, 70, and 72. This proposed rule would affect licensees who may have residual radioactivity in areas within their site boundary and licensees who are required to have decommissioning financial assurance. **Please submit comments to the contact listed below as early as you can, but no later than 30* days from the date of this letter.** Thank you.

Background: The proposed rule would amend regulations to improve decommissioning planning and to reduce the likelihood of future legacy sites. These amendments have been found to have no significant environmental impact. There is an increase in regulatory burden. This rule involves regulations that have been assigned compatibility category "C," "D," and "H&S." Existing compatibility categories are not impacted by this draft final rule.
