**NRC SEALED SOURCE AND DEVICE EVALUATION WORKSHOP (FSME-08-027)**

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) is planning to conduct a 5-day Sealed Source and Device (SS&D) Evaluation Workshop on September 15-19, 2008, in Houston, Texas.

The three objectives of the workshop are: (1) to review product manufacturing techniques and test methods; (2) to familiarize the participant with the NRC SS&D evaluation process; and (3) to review several SS&D casework studies. The workshop will also include onsite tours of manufacturing facilities.

There will be approximately 20 openings available for this workshop. Preference will be given to States with an active SS&D evaluation program. There is no tuition for this workshop.
