---

A nonprofit, voluntary, scientific and professional society incorporated in the District of Columbia.

## The Future of the NMP Alliance

---

The pilot projects demonstrate the suitability and viability of the NMP. Integration challenges remain.

Separate, autonomous organizations must be meshed into a single, coordinated program that meets varied priorities.

The States have long sought greater opportunity for effecting materials regulation. The NMP widens the regulatory resource pool.

NMP means optimized resources that more closely represent business and the public.
